Your Legacy Through Planned Giving

What is the Bur Oak Legacy Society?

The Bur Oak Legacy Society recognizes people who leave a lasting charitable legacy by including the Fort Atkinson Community Foundation (FACF) in their will, trust or estate plan.

By entrusting gifts to FACF, you ensure that your contributions will be used wisely to address future community needs and the causes that you care about the most.

What is Planned Giving?

Planned giving is philanthropy combined with smart financial planning. It helps you make the most of your assets during your lifetime and helps you make future charitable gifts that are often much larger than you may have thought possible.

Together with your financial or legal advisor, we can help you support the charitable organizations you care about while making the most advantageous financial decisions for you and your family.

Benefits of Legacy Giving:

- A role in determining how your legacy gift will be used
- ◆ The knowledge that your legacy will benefit causes you love far beyond your lifetime
- Tax-wise options for managing your estate
- A strong relationship with FACF during your lifetime, including a small welcome gift, personal notes, and regular updates of FACF activities

Why the Bur Oak?



The iconic oak tree of Wisconsin, the majestic Bur Oak represents so much of what we value. Like us, the Bur Oak is long-lived. Its deep roots allow it to tolerate drought and it is resistant to air pollution and heat stress. It endures. In addition, the Bur Oak adds great value to the neighborhood, providing dense shade, shelter, and food for those who count on it. We have many Bur Oaks in Fort Atkinson, most notably, the grove in Jones Park.

How much money do I need to give?

You can leave a gift of any amount. There is no minimum for gifts to existing funds.

The minimum amount to open a new fund through a legacy gift is:

- \$15,000 for a Designated, Donor-Advised or Field of Interest funds
- ♦ \$20,000 for a Scholarship Fund

How long will my named fund last?

Your personal legacy lasts forever through a FACF endowment. Endowments are carefully invested to achieve long-term growth and perpetual distributions to benefit causes and future generations.

Through my involvement with FACF as a director, volunteer scholarship chair, then Program Administrator, I developed a great respect for the Foundation, its governance, and its contributions to the greater Fort Atkinson community. How do I Make a Planned Gift to FACF?

The simplest way to make a planned gift is to designate the Fort Atkinson Community Foundation as a beneficiary of your retirement asset, life insurance policy and/or an investment account held outside of a trust using the relevant asset's beneficiary designation form. Specifically designating FACF as beneficiary of such assets allows the property to pass free of probate and the expenses, court fees, public record requirements and lengthy timelines that goes with it. Additionally, it deserves noting that naming FACF as beneficiary of a retirement account and passing other non-tax deferred assets to your loved ones could spare them and/or your estate a sizable tax bill.

Alternatively, you may also leave a planned gift by including specific language in your will or trust, such as:

I/we bequeath to the Fort Atkinson Community Foundation (tax ID# 39-6220899), located in Fort Atkinson, WI _____ percent of my/our residual estate — OR — the sum of \$_____ to be used for charitable purposes set forth in a Statement of Intent held at the said Community Foundation.

A statement of your intent to leave a gift to FACF is all you need to become a Bur Oak Legacy Society member. We will work with you to determine the specific ways you would like your gift to be used and how you would like to be recognized. Your gift can be used to establish a new fund that reflects your charitable interests or you can add it to any of FACF's existing funds. And you can change your distribution instructions, beneficiaries, and percentages at any time.
